Sowing the Seeds of Hope

Tasneem, an 18-year old girl living in a village near Sargodha, was provided with a sewing machine by As-Siraat less than a year back. She is the eldest of four sisters and one brother. Her father is a laborer with a monthly income of only Rs. 7000. Unfortunately, Tasneem could not continue her education beyond Grade-V due to financial constraints. To support her family, she worked as a maid in Islamabad for a few months, but the young girl had to return to take care of her ill mother. Tasneem had learnt stitching from her neighbour. After receiving a sewing machine from As-Siraat, she was overjoyed at the opportunity of utilizing her skills to earn for her family while staying at home. She zealously started stitching clothes for women in her neighbourhood. Her hard work and dedication started to pay off as she received more and more orders. With dedication and practice, she continued to improve her sewing skills.

Tasneem is currently getting orders on regular basis. On average, she gets more than 20 orders in a month. Thus, she is able to earn approximately Rs. 7,000 per month. The number of orders increase during festive occasions like Eid and weddings. With the help of her sewing machine, Tasneem has practically doubled the income of her family! She feels happy and proud at being able to assist her father in shouldering household expenses. Circumstances did not allow her to complete her education, but she is now paying for her younger siblings' education, and encouraging them to pursue their studies

whole-heartedly.
