Parveen Shakir

24 November 1952 - 26 December 1994

Perveen Shakir had a passion for writing, and like any other lover of the creative language arts, she started early. She would write Urdu poetry for daily newspapers, and blog in English. It is said that she would often write under the pseudonym Beena. You may have heard of the fabled poetry collection **Khushboo** by this talented poetess.

Starting with her matriculation in the year 1966, this amazing genius went on to do her Masters in English Literature and Linguistics. She then took up position as an instructor of the English Language before joining the Civil Service. Perveen Shakir was then appointed as the second secretary in the Federal Board of Revenue, Islamabad. She is even reported to have taught for a long time at Abdullah College.

Born on 24 November 1952, five years after Pakistan came into being, Shakir's first volume of verse Khushbu (Fragrance) was published in 1976 to national recognition. She went on to pen down incredible works of art including **Sad-Barg (Marsh Marigold)** in 1980, **Khud Kalami (Talking to Oneself)** and **Inkaar (Denial)** in 1990, and Kaf e Aeina (The Mirror's Edge) first published in 1996. She was awarded the prestigious civil service award Pride of Performance in 1976 in recognition for her extraordinary commitment to writing. Some of her works of poetry have been compiled together in the volume **Mah e Tamam**.

Perveen's poetic style varies between the ghazal and free verse. She would write on varied topics like women, love, nationalism, bravery and others. She was a brave lady who was bringing up her only son, Murad, alone whilst working professionally. On her way to work one day, Perveen Shakir met a **road accident** in Islamabad and died at the youthful age of 42 years on 26 December, 1994.
